Long-distance phone lines often work before local phone lines, so identify an out-of-state contact and provide this person with the contact information of people you want to keep informed of your situation.

Marin County is vulnerable to a wide variety of hazards, both natural and man-made. Be familiar with the potential emergencies you may encounter in your area.

TIPS ON WHAT TO DO IF THERE IS A(N):

EARTHQUAKE

If you are indoors when shaking starts:

- "DROP, COVER AND HOLD ON." If you are not near a strong table or desk, drop to the floor against an interior wall and cover your head and neck with your arms.
- Do not try to run out of the structure during strong shaking.

If you are outdoors when shaking starts:

- Move to a clear area if you can safely walk. Avoid power lines, buildings and trees.
- If you're driving, pull to the side of the road and stop. Avoid stopping under overhead hazards.
- If you are on the beach, move to higher ground. An earthquake can cause a tsunami.

Once the earthquake shaking stops:

- Check the people around you for injuries; provide first aid. Do not move seriously injured persons unless they are in immediate danger.
- Turn off the gas only if you smell it, see it, or hear it.

FLOOD/STORM:

- If water has entered a garage or basement, do not walk through it – it may contain hazardous materials.
- Do not try to drive over a flooded road. If your car stalls, abandon it immediately. Attempting to move a stalled vehicle in flood conditions can be fatal.
- If you are asked to leave your property, disconnect all electrical appliances.

TSUNAMI

A local earthquake may generate tsunami waves that can reach shore in minutes. If you are on the beach or other low-lying area close to the ocean or bay, immediately evacuate by walking to higher ground if:

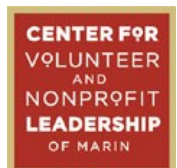
- Officials issue a tsunami warning and/or order evacuations.
- You hear the Outdoor Warning System.
- The earth shakes so much that you can't stand.
- Shaking lasts longer than 20 seconds and/or you notice water receding from the shoreline.

GENERAL EVACUATION:

Emergency evacuation orders may be announced through radio and/or television. If so, use the evacuation routes and methods specified; carpool whenever possible. If possible:

- Wear sturdy shoes, long-sleeve shirts and pants.
- Bring your go-bag, car keys, credit cards, road maps, cell phone, charger and important phone numbers.
- Once you arrive at a safe location, call your out-of-area emergency contact.
